

Armenian Christmas is something entirely different. The word for Christmas in Armenian is *Astvats-a-haydnutyun*, which is made of two words *Astvats/*God and *Haydnel/*Reveal, that is, the way that God continues to reveal himself to man.

Thus, Armenian Christmas reminds us that it is not that important whether \underline{we} put up trees; give out presents or even put baby Jesus in front of our house. Whatever thing \underline{we} do it is not very important during Astvats-a-haydnutyun because this holiday isn't not about us, it is about God.




Women's Guild News
