

PASTOR'S DESK by Fr. Hovnan Demerjian



The Amazing Journey of Great Lent

This month we begin Great Lent, our forty day journey of fasting and prayer. We celebrate Great Lent because Jesus himself fasted and prayed for forty days before his ministry of salvation (Matt. 4:4). Jesus was not teaching us to punish ourselves, but to restore ourselves to complete dependence on God. Here are eight ways to embark on a life-changing Lenten journey:

- **1 Read the Bible.** Enjoy God's story and grow closer to what He's telling you through it. Follow the Armenian Church calendar of readings as a guide. Or: Read the entire Gospel of Mark. Or: Read all 4 Gospels. Or: Read 10 minutes a day starting with Matthew and see how far the 40-day journey takes you.
- **2 Attend church.** Follow the Sunday lessons and weeknight Lenten services and then walk with Christ during His last days through the pageantry and prayer of Holy Week.
- **3 Pray.** Only when we realize our emptiness without God, can Lenten prayer begin. St. Gregory of Narek eloquently declared that prayer is an "effective medicine for invisible pain." And so we pray unceasingly.
- **4 Fast.** Lenten hunger makes people healthy, purifies your body, limits your consumption of the world's resources, and generates less waste. Fasting allows silence and restraint to replace gratification. In the same way, fast for your mind as well, refraining from excessive entertainment talking, and distractions.
- **5 Simplify.** Change your habits and lifestyle to focus your attention on God and His direction for you. Spend less time shopping, in front of the TV and at the computer and more quiet time with family and friends. This will remind you of how precious life and loved ones are.
- **6 Give Up Something Special.** Whether it's chocolate, TV, long phone conversations, pick something that's become important to you. Doing without it can remind us of what's really important.
- **7 Change.** Like the hungry little caterpillar that becomes a butterfly, your 40 day "cocoon" can be a time of true renewal. Are you impatient? Do you get angry easily? Are you a gossip? Try to change.
- **8 Give.** Lent invites us to give our time, our money, and our imaginative efforts to our church, to feed the hungry and visit the lonely.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT by Stepan H. Serpekian

Our Parish assembly took place on Sunday January 30th, 2011. Five members were elected for two years, Andrew Anusbigian, Chris Sassouni, David Kazarian, Stepan Serpekian and Tanya Sarafian. The remainder of the Parish Council, Chuck Begian, Linda Maslar, Karen Minassian and John Shamsey are serving the last year of their two year committment.

On Tuesday February 6, 2011 we had our regular Parish Council meeting. We selected the officers of the Parish Council, Stepan H Serpekian - Chairman, David Kazarian - Vice Chairman, Chris Sassouni - Treasure, Linda Maslar - Assistant Treasurer, Chuck Begian - Secretary and Karen Minassian - Assistant Secretary/Corresponding. Welcome to our new members, Tanya and Andrew we look forward to their energy and contribution to the team.

Also, at the Parish Assembly, we had our proposed budget for 2011. We have a projected budget of \$302,500 in expenses and a projected income of \$311,000. If we break down our expenses to the total paid membership of 140, each paid member has a daily obligation of \$6.00 and if we double that amount we can witness another milestone miracle in the form of the multipurpose building.

Our annual fundraising Gala, Kef Time, which was held on February 12th, was supported by over 125 members of the community, who enjoyed a night of dining and dancing. Thank You to everyone who attended! The proceeds from this event will help lower the principle on our mortgage leading the way to the day that we will have a mortgage burning event. What a dream! Can we do it? YES, we can. We are Armenians, the builders of homes and guardians of our culture.

Ask yourself this question, which came first the chicken or the egg. In our scenario the church came first and now is time to work towards building a multipurpose building. There is no time better than the present to get started. Those who are building a house will be poor for one year and those who sell a house will be rich for one year. Take a look at yourself and which option would you like to have.

I would like to thank the community on their trust in our effort to keep St Hagop's mission alive and contribute to the future of our children to stay Armenians in heart and soul.


