TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG ARMENIAN COMMUNITY COMMEMORATES THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE

On April 24, 2015, Gulf Coast Armenians will join Armenians around the world in solemnly remembering the great tragedy that befell their people in 1915.

In that year, more than 1.5 million Armenians—25% percent of the entire population of Armenians in the world at that time—were massacred by the Ottoman Turks. This was the first attempt at genocide perpetrated in modern times. Indeed, the very word "genocide" (denoting the destruction of an entire people) was originally coined in 1944 to describe the policy of systematic extermination which the Ottoman regime used against the Armenian population, and the Nazis waged on European Jews.

This year marks the 100th anniversary of this dark episode, and a series of specially orchestrated events are taking place around the world and here locally in the Tampa/St. Petersburg region on and around April 24th:
