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
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# PASTOR'S DESK by Father Hovnan Demerjian

# Pastor's Desk: Just Do Your Part!

For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. (1 Cor. 13:12)

The apostle Paul, who was given divine revelation, wrote down most of the New Testament and is known simply in Armenian as The Great Apostle, wrote that he knew "only in part." It goes without saying that if Paul knew only in part, how much more this must be true for us. Paul's famous phrase reminds us of a principle of the spiritual life; because we only know a very small fraction of what there is to know, humility is always in order.

In the past I have written and spoken on this text to knock each of us down a notch, me first, in feeling prideful about whatever we accomplish in this world, be it success, intelligence or wealth. Here, I want to come from the other direction, not bringing down our puffed-up worldly endeavors, but raising up our humble heavenly endeavors, our worship and service of our Lord at St. Hagop Armenian Church. I think our community needs this, because there is a very strong temptation in church life to judge the work we do by the same measure that we have been trained to judge all accomplishment in our livesby the numbers, by the appearance and by the applause. In a word, we are trained to judge by the results. This is so engrained in us, that some of you might be asking yourselves, "How else am I supposed to judge something except by its results?" Well, the Gospels show us a different way. Using myriad examples, Jesus tells us that in the work of the kingdom, which is our work at St. Hagop, it is only our part to sow the seed, while it is God's part to bring forth the fruit or result. As the saying goes, "Do your best and leave the results to God."

This spiritual advice is so easy to say and yet so hard to do, especially when we care so much about our church, our God and our heritage. With such high stakes, it is often our good, albeit misguided, intention to accomplish church work with perfection. This hymn must be perfectly sung, we tell ourselves, or the banquet must be perfectly decorated or the event must be perfectly attended. There is no problem of course with trying our best, which is in our control, there is however a big problem with trying to be perfect, which tries to control the end and the results. I would go so far as to say that most conflict we have in church is at root decent people fighting to control results, allowing pride to insist that "this program (or event, or purchase, or decoration) must be done like this, not like this." This struggle for control easily becomes personal, and quickly anger and anxiety choke the fruits of the Spirit from growing as God would have it. But it does not have to be this way. If we learn even a little bit to "Do our best and leave the results to God," the seeds we sow in and through this church are so powerful that they can change a life, heal a soul and move mountains.

Fred Rogers, of Mr. Roger's Neighborhood fame, told a story in an interview, which illustrates this humble power. When he was studying to become a Presbyterian minister, he visited a different church each Sunday to learn to preach by watching others. One week he experienced what he thought "the most poorly crafted sermon he had ever heard." But a friend had accompanied him on this Sunday, and when he turned to her, he found her in tears. Holding back his surprise, she confided to him; "this was exactly what I needed to hear." Rogers then told his audience, "That's when I realized that the space between someone doing the best he or she can and someone in need is holy ground. The Holy Spirit had transformed that feeble sermon for her, and as it turned out, for me too." Beloved St. Hagop parishioners, be very very careful of judging anyone's efforts, including your own, in this church, for you may find yourself standing in the way of God!

My prayer for all of you who are reading this newsletter is that we all continue to grow in faith and humility by serving our Lord and our beloved St. Hagop Armenian Church. I pray we remember that, this side of heaven, we will never know the people we have impacted through our faithful service because "Now we know only in part." But if we can learn to "Do our best and leave the results to God," to "trust steadily, hope unswervingly and love extravagantly," we will be astonished at how God transforms our efforts, our church, our selves into results we could never conceive, accomplish or even imagine.

# PARISH COUNCIL REPORT by Michael Shahnasarian, Ph.D.

The lazy days of summer have been far from that at St. Hagop.

Our major efforts, described below, have related to stewardship, church staffing, and church hall improvements. Of course, there are many other initiatives in progress.

## Stewardship

Stewardship development at St. Hagop has been a major parish council priority the past few years. Our planning has culminated in efforts to convert from a dues membership system to a pledge membership system – an objective we plan to accomplish on January 1, 2017.

Quite likely, you recently received a mailing containing: a) an article describing reasons for the change, b) responses to frequently asked questions, and c) a pledge form. We pray you will review these materials and participate in our conversion by completing your pledge form and submitting it at our October 30th Badarak, which we designated as Pledge Sunday. If you cannot attend church that day, please submit your form another day or mail it to St. Hagop. We need all forms by November 15th so we can order envelopes necessary to begin our pledge system by January 1st.

Our stewardship initiatives have gone well beyond the print medium. Fr. Hovnan's sermons have enlightened us on the centrality of giving and life as practicing Christian Armenians, and parishioners have participated in our membership system conversion efforts. Chris Sasouni and Grace Austin provided testimonials in August and September, and Hagop Mashikian will provide his in October. These inspirational testimonials have addressed beliefs about stewardship and reasons to make an annual pledge to St. Hagop.

Also, as part of our stewardship development activities, John Shamsey, an estate lawyer, and former parish council member and active parishioner, has provided parishioners confidential consultations on their estate plans, inclusive of naming St. Hagop an estate beneficiary. Please contact me or another parish council member if you desire more information on how you can incorporate St. Hagop into your will.

As you pray and contemplate your 2017 pledge to St. Hagop, please be mindful of our command from Hebrews 13:16, *Don't neglect to do good and share what you have.* 

# Church Hall Enhancements

St. Hagop received a certificate of occupancy for its church hall hours before holding its first function in it – a 2016 New Year's Eve celebration – and has since been growing into the facility. This growth has included enhancements aimed to improve the hall's aesthetics and functionality. A perimeter security system, outdoor lighting, and fine carpentry work has been installed within the past two months. Chandeliers and window treatments are on the horizon; we have also added needed kitchen glassware, utensils, and appliances, along with office furnishings.

Our aim in making these improvements is both to enhance our facilities for St. Hagop's use, as well as to make the hall an attractive venue for members in and outside our church community to lease. It should be noted that monies necessary to fund these enhancements derived entirely from designated parishioner donations; no church operating funds were used.

With a seating capacity of approximately 280, entertainment stage, and large, fully-equipped bar, our church hall facilities also include a well-equipped commercial kitchen and fine audiovisual capabilities. We believe our facilities can attract those in need of the type of venue St. Hagop offers, which by extension provides an opportunity to develop our church hall into a profit center, generating revenue to help fund church operations. Chuck Sarkisian developed a marketing plan to facilitate this objective and, in September, St. Hagop hired a marketing support coordinator/administrative assistant (more information

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about our new staff member is below) to promote our facilities to the broader community.

Natella Mouradian and Karen Minassian – interior design professionals in their lives outside St. Hagop - have been especially active in directing our church hall enhancements. Please let Karen, Natella, me, or another parish council member know if you have an interest in contributing to our ongoing church hall enhancements.

## Church Staffing

The growth of our parish, as you would expect, necessitates greater demands for administrative time and labor. Fr. Hovnan has, over the years, absorbed much of this work; regrettably, this has encroached on his time to perform ministerial work - a priest's raison de etre.

Over the summer, your parish council approved creating a marketing support coordinator/administrative assistant position. After an extensive applicant search, God brought Kelli Pilsbury to St. Hagop Armenian Church to assume this role. Kelli joined our St. Hagop church family in September. Her job responsibilities are twofold: facilitating rentals of our church hall facilities, and providing administrative support for our church operations. Prior to St. Hagop, Kelli worked in comparable positions with St. Stefanos Greek Orthodox Church (2011 – 2015) and Azalea Baptist Church (2008 – 2010).

In addition to being a person of faith, Kelli's character bespeaks values St. Hagop holds dear. She is compassionate, plain-spoken, and principled. On a personal level, I have been particularly impressed by her knowledge of church operations, community resources, and creativity. Kelli will be a valuable partner in our walk together to accomplish what our Lord calls us to do.

#### Other Initiatives

With a church hall capable of featuring events of all sorts, St. Hagop established an event programming committee; this group plans and schedules Armenian Christian and Armenian cultural programs of interest to our congregation and broader community. To this end, the committee has on its drawing board cultural events ranging from an in-house talent show to performances by renowned Armenian performing artists, along with traditional Armenian Christian observances and ecumenical events.

The Women's Guild, under the leadership of Lena Kotchounian, has continued to ensure our Sunday fellowship foods meet the taste of all palates . . . this is no small feat! Everything from Armenian baked pastries and other delicacies to healthy food options are available. Particularly well received have been Armenian cooking classes the Women's Guild has sponsored.

Sunday School began on September 11th. What a heart-warming sight it is to see the children – our next generation of Armenian Christians – participating in Badarak and other church rituals.

Looking ahead, Stepan Serpekian has continued to ably lead St. Hagop in hosting the 2017 Eastern Diocese convention. We expect over 300 clergy, church leaders, and other faithful to participate in events over a one-week period in May 2017, the 115th Eastern Diocese convention!

It is hard to believe our church was built only 9 years ago (yes, we will celebrate the anniversary on Saturday, October 22<sup>nd</sup> mark your calendar!). Investments in our infrastructure – stewardship development, church hall improvements, and staffing – we pray, will yield dividends necessary to augment Christian ministries we have pursued and intend to more aggressively pursue.

St. Hagop is at the threshold of securing its foundation and positioning to expand its ministries, allowing us to rise to God's calling. As we evolve to this higher-order calling we are compelled to remember *The son of man did not come to be served but to serve.* (Matthew 20:28) God has and continues to grace St. Hagop Armenian Church. We are, indeed, a blessed community.
